Spring is “busting out all over”. The outdoor plants are leafing out and my Star Magnolia is blooming. What a show on the west windowsill! I have *Sinningia lineata*, *Sinningia cardinalis* ‘Redcoat’, a peloric *Sinningia cardinalis* hybrid, two *Sinningia macropoda* hybrids, and two *Sinningia leucotricha* hybrids in bloom. Wow! Both color forms of *Sinningia speciosa* ‘Cardoso Moreira’, the pink and the purple, are putting up strong shoots, so I hope to get flowers and seed from one or both later in the year. On the light stand, *Sinningia velutina* has been blooming for the first time.

I was happy to be able to join a group of our members at the park in Manhattan last month. We sold quite a few plants, even luring a passerby, who used to be a Gesneriad grower, to shop. It's not like a real meeting, but it was good to see so many people again.

For our next Zoom program, we will be honored to have Bruce and Bev Williams as guest presenters discussing the fibrous rooted Old World plants that they grow so well. Hope to see you there.

On the left is Michael Riley's *Sinningia cardinalis*. This old standby has been in cultivation for decades, but today its natural distribution is in a very limited range up on the mountains outside the city of Rio de Janeiro. On the right is *Sinningia bragae*, grown by Tsuh Yang Chen. This species was only discovered in 1993, also near Rio, and grows on rocky cliffs. Both species are highly endangered. Ron Myhr, of Toronto, shared these photos of his plants of *Sinningia minima* (left) and *Sinningia pusilla* (right). *Sinningia pusilla* has been in cultivation for decades, and is one of the three miniature species found on the Atlantic rainforest near Rio (the other two are *S. concinna* and the recently described *S. muscicola*). These three species have been widely used for hybridization of smaller sinningias in cultivation. *S. minima* is quite an outlier as it is found in the Amazon region, thousands of miles away. Look at the differences between these two species. *S. minima* flowers are also much smaller than the flowers of the other three species.
